



2020 Street Rehabilitation Project

Construction Update

August 14, 2020

Street Reclamation:

The Contractor will begin street reclamation on the remaining project streets **Monday, August 17th**. These include 79th Way, Longfellow Street, Hugo Street, Ironton Street, Ruth Street and Ashton Avenue. Street reclamation grinds the first 6"-8" of the existing roadway into a suitable aggregate base for the new pavement. This work will begin on 79th Way and move north through the project area. The Contractor will immediately follow the street reclamation with grading to prepare the base and provide a drivable surface.

Watermain Replacement:

Watermain and service replacement work has been completed on Ely Street, and the Contractor will continue this work on Liberty and Longfellow Street. As replacement work begins in these areas, the Contractor will transition homeowners to temporary water service until the new main and services are reinstated.

Street Parking:

As a reminder, we ask that no personal vehicles or property be parked on project area streets during working hours (7am-7pm Mon-Fri). This gives the Contractor room to work and prevents any damage to personal property. Streets adjacent to the project area can be used for temporary street parking during these times.

Resident Access

The City and Contractor will do everything possible to minimize the inconvenience to residents in the construction areas.

However, please note that this type of construction may generate noise, dust, and mud, and is generally a disruption to the area. Residents will have access to their driveways during construction except when major construction events are occurring on their street.

Although it is tempting and interesting to watch, it is very important that residents, including children, remain out of the immediate work zone.

Please remember to be safe and drive cautiously wherever you see construction workers, equipment and warning signs.
